Not Your Ordinary Stoner

Mystery and Romance. Romance and Mystery. Plus an endearing lesbian protagonist and great plots. Especially if you like some fantasy / psychic twists with your mysteries.

Meet Stoner McTavish, born, in the literary sense, in 1985, aged about 30. She lives in Boston with her Aunt Hermione, a psychic, and runs a travel agency with her friend, Marylou. (Stoner's parents are real baddies!) Stoner reluctantly goes to find a young bride, Gwen, after Gwen's grandmother suspects the new groom of bad intentions. You will have to read *Stoner McTavish* to discover just what the groom's plans are and to meet the lovely Gwen.

Sarah Dreher has written at least seven Stoner McTavish mysteries. The first was published when Dreher was 48. She came out at 35 and is now 72, living in Amherst, Massachusetts.

Stonewall has most of the Stoner McTavish books on its shelves. Why not read a couple? There are great mysteries with lots of lesbian content.

Stoner McTavish (1985) First in the series, and (I think) the best place to start, though each novel can stand on its own.

Something Shady (1986) A small Maine village, a disappearance and a "suspicious rest home."

Gray Magic (1989) Gwen and Stoner vacation in Arizona and find Hopi magic instead of R & R.

A Captive in Time (1990) Don't be surprised to discover Stoner in 1871 Colorado Territory complete with saloons, witches and suffragists. After all she was named for Lucy B. Stone!

Other World (1993) What is more fun, modern and "normal" than a vacation in Disney World? There is more (or less) than meets the eye in the tunnels under the Magic Kingdom.

Bad Company (1995) Problems in a women's theater company located in Cambridge. Stoner and Gwen are asked to help, but giving help may come at a cost.

Shaman's Moon (1998) In this psychological thriller, there is no need to leave sleepy Shelburne Falls. Stoner, Gwen and Marylou must discover why "hungry ghosts" are preying upon Aunt Hermione. Stoner's spiritual and psychological journey to help her aunt brings up her own past demons.

Love Murders (2004?) According to some sources, this is unpublished; other sources give 2004 as the publication date. DEAR READER, if you have a copy, Stonewall Library would appreciate owning it. If you have read it, let me know. I would personally love to read it!

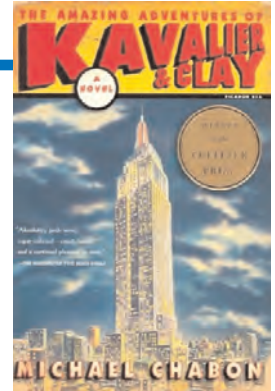

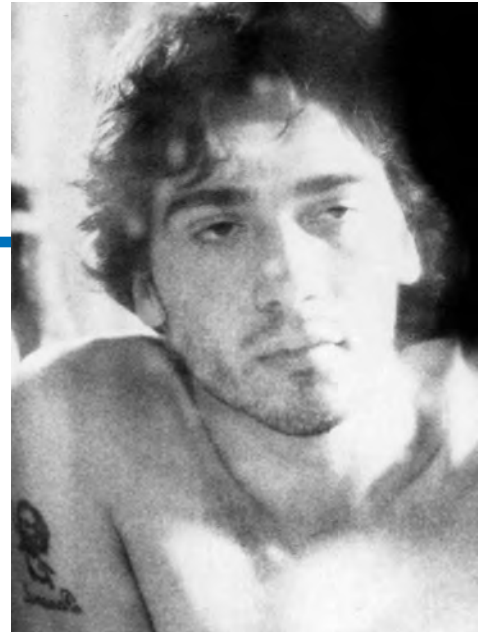
